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FROM THE DIRECTOR

A major change to Campus Recreation Department occurred on September 6, 2021. This is the date when the Student Activities Council (SAC) was put under the umbrella of Campus Recreation. In the short run, there was not much time to plan or think of the positive or negative consequences of this change to the department. Fifty plus activities and programs and two full-time professional staff and one graduate assistant were transferred to our department, and everything had to continue to run like the programs had done successfully in the past.

This transition would have been much more difficult with out the knowledge and dedication of Tia Hill. Tia and her staff hit the ground running. The activities office also had a couple of new directives in addition to moving departments and offices. SAC was tasked to schedule more weekend programming and have one "big concert" at Koch Arena. Twenty-Three weekend events took place this past fiscal year and on Friday, April 15, 2022, the Wale concert was the first of what will become an annual concert event on campus. SAC even won an award for outstanding new program: Fairmount Formal.



Throughout the year the staff came together and developed a new name "Campus Activities and Recreation", in addition to a new mission, vision, and values. I am very proud of the staff to take on this major change within our department with a positive outlook and the result was highly successful programs and services for Shocker students and a successful transition for the department.

There were many other accomplishments within the department this past year. The outdoor sports courts had a complete overhaul. The old asphalt was pulverized, and new reinforced concrete was installed. Furthermore, the lighting system was updated for the first time in 30 years. Four new pickleball courts were added, and we moved the futsal and basketball courts to the north end of the complex. In November 2022, the pickleball courts were opened and the courts have been a big success with students and the community.

Community outreach continues to be a big part of our strategic plan. The Michael Phelps Grant allowed us to teach swimming lessons to over 200 Boys and Girls Club members. Pulling for Youth Horizons is a program for "at risk kids" in partnership between WSU Rowing and Wichita Parks and Recreation held at the River Vista Boathouse. This program won the State of Kansas Recreation award for a new pilot program at the March 1 City of Wichita Council meeting. Lastly, we had over 450 runners for our annual pumpkin run event, which was a great number with COVID having an impact again this year on our programs and services.

A challenge for us all year was staffing issues due to the low \$7.25/hr. student staff wage. This wage was particularly difficult to attract intramural sports officials. The Student Staff was excited that the Student Government Association funded a raise from \$7.25 to \$10 as a minimum rate. Intramural Sports are planning to add new activities this coming year because of our ability to hire student staff.

Coming out of COVID, I was extremely pleased by the participation numbers in all our programs. The gymnasium courts were full most evenings with basketball and badminton being the most popular sports. New programs were added such as Dive-In-Movies & Fairmount Formal. Older programs such as Freight night and the Drag Show had large numbers. It was evident that Students were looking for social activities after two years of COVID affecting their college experience.

As we look to the future, Campus Activities and Recreation is well positioned to have a significant impact on the Shocker Experience through our vast variety of programs and services that will attract and retain WSU Students and have a positive impact on student's mental health.







ASSESSMENT



Campus Activities & Recreation (CAR) programs and services enhance the student experience in many ways and evidence continues to demonstrate the degree to which various forms of activities and recreation influence multiple, student-related outcomes.

Retention directly correlates with a student's sense of community on campus. At Wichita State University, CAR fosters that community through the events, programs, and services offered annually. In the past year our Student Activities Council and department hosted offers over 50 plus social, cultural, and educational events; students challenge themselves physically and mentally through participation in over 25 intramural sports; students developed leadership skills and comradery through participation in sports clubs and Shocker Rowing; we fostered a sense of belonging to hundreds of students, faculty, staff, and community members who visited our facilities, and supported over 100 student employees. Our staff take pride in developing a sense of community to all students we engage with by creating a supportive environment that fosters applied learning and helps students reach their goal of becoming a Wichita State graduate.

Finding a community and being active has proven to help with mental health. CAR is uniquely situated through exercise, activities, programs, and services to have a positive impact on mental health. An emphasis for the department this past year was to have more weekend programing particularly for those students living on-campus and in the surrounding community. CAR hosted over 23 weekend programs in FY 22 allowing students to have fun, learn, meet new friends and de-stress. Positive mental health significantly improves retention at Wichita State University.

Campus Activities & Recreation supports the university in recruiting future Shockers through our many community-based initiatives like Boats and Bikes, partnerships with USD 259, swim lessons and large events like our Pumpkin Run and Spring Concert. Additionally, our staff participates in recruitment by attending Admissions "Road Shows" throughout the state and region. At these events CAR informs potential Shockers of the unique programing that is offered through our department. CAR also welcomes the Student Shocker Navigators who host tours of the Heskett Center facility frequently throughout the year and highlights all CAR's program and services. Furthermore, CAR runs events in collaboration with Admissions on Black and Yellow days (high school juniors, seniors, and college transfer students' recruitment). The Rowing team directly recruits students to come to Wichita State University who otherwise would not attend.

CAR's outcomes are directly in line with the University goals and initiatives. The programs and services we offered and executed in this last year contribute towards being Student Centered, creating a vibrant Campus Culture, working towards inclusive excellence, and being an active partner who engages with the local community.

STUDENT EVENTS, PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Campus Activities & Recreation contribute to a vibrant campus life that contributes to the retention of students through a variety of events, programs, and services. The Student Activities Council, the university student led programming board, is enhances the Shocker experience through the execution of over 50 social, educational, and cultural events. The department supports a sense of belonging for students through the execution of staff driven programs, initiatives and services such as F45, intramural sports, and spaces that support an active lifestyle.

ASSESSMENT RESULTS

NAME OF ASSESSMENT: POST-EVENT EVALUATION

Purpose: Sent to students following their participation in a select number of Campus Activities sponsored events over the course of the academic year. Evaluation measures students' satisfaction in the programs, their connection to campus as an outcome of the program, and what marketing they may have noticed for the event.

Key takeaways:

- ► 5.61/6 was the average rating of respondents based on their willingness to attend future programs hosted by the department
- ▶ 5.25/6 was the average rating of respondents based on the programs ability to make them feel included/like they belong on campus
- ▶ The top three forms of marketing noticed by respondents included posters, word of mouth, and Shocker Blast

NAME OF ASSESSMENT: CAMPUS ACTIVITIES AND RECREATION PARTICIPANT SURVEY

Purpose: To gain insight in how intramural, outdoor adventures, fitness and special events were viewed by participants

Key takeaways:

- ▶ 85% of participants had a positive experience.
- ▶ 80% of participants felt included and accepted while participating in this event.

NAME OF ASSESSMENT: STUDENT STAFF DEVELOPMENT

Purpose: To gage if student employees are improving their professional skills.

Key takeaways:

- ▶ 92% of students felt confident managing a participant's concern.
- ▶ 20% of students don't feel comfortable making a decision with out prior approval (something we need to improve)

BENCHMARKING-UNIVERSITY BENCHMARK PROJECT

CAR participates in this benchmarking assessment annually and uses the data for the metrics in the Student Affairs "Action Plan". The action plan correlates with the WSU Strategic Plan.




