

## Format

Akin to PechaKucha, Ignite presentations consist of 20 slides that auto-advance every 15 seconds for a total presentation time of 5 minutes – followed by 3 minutes of Q&A.

## Theme

Are you content with the current education system or would you like to suggest some improvements or changes for future generations in engineering and technology education? **We are looking for Ignite presentations that highlight ideas and/or experiences that can impact or lead to change in engineering and technology education.**

## Judging Criteria

Selected Ignite presentations will be scheduled during one or more sessions and adjudicated for the best student presentation award based on the following criteria:

- Ideas that have significant impact and are viable
- Ideas and experiences that are relevant to the conference theme: **Applied Learning and Industry Partnerships Enhancing Engineering Education**
- Presentations that are clear, stimulating and well executed

## Submissions

Submit a brief summary of your talk (less than one page) before July 15, 2019. The summary should include:

- Problem being addressed
- Why this is important to you
- Who does it affect
- How do you plan to solve it
- What do you need to take this forward or what is your call to action

Submissions are evaluated by a panel of undergraduate and graduate students. Authors will be notified via email by July 19, 2019 if they have been accepted for an Ignite presentation.

## EXAMPLE

The Ignite abstract is a 250 word description (or less), of the change you wish to see in engineering and technology education. This abstract does not need to be the manuscript of your presentation, it merely serves to get the outline and goal of your presentation across. Abstracts will be evaluated based on the potential impact and viability of the ideas presented and the story that it seeks to get across.
