What: Opening reception for a new exhibition, "Southwest Archaeology, The Ewing Site: An Unusually Rich and Surprising Place"

The Wichita State University Spring 2012 Museum Exhibition class will hold a reception for the open their new exhibition, "Southwest Archaeology, The Ewing Site: An Unusually Rich and Surprising Place" containing artifacts from the Ewing Site at the Lowell D. Holmes Museum of Anthropology, Neff Hall, on Monday, April 23, 2012 from 4:00 to 5:30. The exhibition will display pottery, unique jewelry, and photographs describing the Mesa Verde inhabitants of the Ewing Archaeological Site from approximately AD 1050 to 1150. It also describes the excavation process performed by Dr. Arthur Rohn and subsequent analysis by Wichita State University archaeologists and students. This site is located in the southwest corner of Colorado and reveals a lot of information about the prehistoric peoples of the American Southwest during a time of major transition.
