Celebrate the Moon

The Lake Afton Public Observatory in conjunction with the Kansas Astronomical Observers (KAO) is celebrating International Observe the Moon Night on Saturday, October 12. So pack up the family and come out to the Lake Afton Public Observatory to get acquainted with our nearest celestial neighbor. As a bonus, if you can give us an interesting fact or event related to the Moon, you get half off your admission (examples can be found on our website at webs.wichita.edu/lapo).

On International Observe the Moon Night the Observatory will be open from 7:30 pm until 10:00 pm and present the program, *Celebrity Craters*. Craters on the Moon are, for the most part, named after famous scientists. As you look through the big 16-inch telescope at selected craters, the Observatory staff will discuss the scientists after which the craters were named and talk about some of their achievements.

In addition to the program inside the Observatory, members of the KAO will have some of their telescopes set up on the observing pad outside, to the North of the observatory building from 7:00 pm until 11:00 pm. You are encouraged to visit with them and look through their telescopes to learn even more about the Moon. Regular admission charges apply only if you wish to come inside the Observatory building to take advantages of our exhibits and observing programs.

Opening Times and Admission

From October 1st through December 22nd, the Lake Afton Public Observatory is open to the public every Friday and Saturday evening from 7:30 until 10:00 p.m. Admission to the Observatory is just \$5 for adults, \$3 for children ages 6-12, and children under 6 get in for free.
