Learn How to Use Your Telescope

If you have a telescope and haven't quite figured out how to get the most out of it yet --you are in luck. The Lake Afton Public Observatory and the Kansas Astronomical Observers (KAO) invite you to bring your telescope to the observatory for one or more of their Bring Your Own Telescope evenings this summer. At these events, members of the KAO will be on hand to help you learn how to take full advantage of your telescope's capabilities. Bring your telescope to the table set up outside the front entrance of the observatory where members of the KAO will be waiting to assist you.

KAO members will also have a number of different types of telescopes available for you to look through. So, if you don't have a telescope but are thinking of buying one, you might consider attending one or more of these Bring Your Own Telescope programs to get more information about the different types of telescopes available, along with their advantages and disadvantages.

There is no charge for the Bring Your Own Telescope program, however if you would also like to attend the Observatory's evening program, and take in their interesting exhibits, regular admission charges will apply. The KAO and Lake Afton Public Observatory will be hosting Bring Your Own Telescope evenings on the third Friday of each month, May through August.

Opening Times and Admission

Through August 31st, the Lake Afton Public Observatory is open to the public on Friday and Saturday evenings from 9:00 – 11:00 pm. Observatory admission is \$6 for adults, \$4 for children ages 6-12, and children under 6 get in for free. There is also a special family rate where 2 adults and their immediate minor children or grandchildren get in for \$18.00. Location

The Observatory is located about 20 miles southwest of downtown Wichita on MacArthur Road at 247th Street West in Lake Afton County Park. It is immediately north of the lake, just off MacArthur Road. Lake Afton can be reached by any of the following routes: west from Wichita on U.S. 54 to the Lake Afton sign at Viola Road three miles past Goddard, then three miles south and one mile east; or southwest on K-42, 7 miles to Schulte and nine miles west on MacArthur.
