Business Prospects under NAFTA²0

- North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) marked its 20th anniversary, it is critical to understand how the agreement has generated vast new opportunities for the U.S. **NAFTA is now the largest free trade agreement in the world.**Since 1994 NAFTA, trade with Canada and Mexico has increased three-and-half fold to \$1.2 trillion, and the two countries buy about one-third of U.S. merchandise exports.
 Trade with Canada and Mexico supports nearly 14 million U.S. jobs.
 The expansion of trade by NAFTA supports tens of thousands of jobs in each of the 50
- states—and more than 100,000 jobs in 17 states.
 NAFTA has been a boon to the competitiveness of U.S. manufacturers, which added more than 800,000 jobs in the four years after NAFTA
- NAFTA has been a bonanza for U.S. farmers and ranchers, helping U.S. agricultural exports to Canada and Mexico triple and quintuple, respectively.
- With new market access and clearer rules afforded by NAFTA, U.S. services exports to Canada and Mexico bave tripled, rising from \$27 billion in 1993 to \$85 billion in 2012.
