The Learned Ladies by Moliere

Moliere's comedy, which takes a look at academic pretention, focuses on the lives of a group of "learned ladies" and their insatiable obsession for learning and high-brow culture of the conceited kind. Mix in a love triangle, a weak-minded husband, and a grammatically incorrect housemaid and you have one of Moliere's most-beloved comedy of manners. (Rating G)

Susannah Opera by Carlisle Floyd Co-directed by Guest Artist Samuel Ramey and Marie King Oct. 17-19 at 7:30 pm and Oct. 20 at 2:00 pm Miller Concert Hall Based on the biblical tale of Susanna and the Elders, Floyd sets his American opera in the Appalachian mountains, using musical idioms ranging from simple folk tunes to soaring Puccinilike melodies. Susanna is a young girl living in an isolated area falsely accused of being a slut. Preacher Blitch comes to demand that she repent but she refuses. He then seduces her and is horrified to find that she is innocent. Olin Blitch is one of Samuel Ramey's signature roles and in addition to co-directing the opera will portray Blitch in alternate performances. This production coincides with Mr. Ramey's 2013-14 residency at WSU. (Rating PG)

Guys and Dolls Music and Lyrics by Frank Loesser, Book by Jo Swerling and Abe Burrows

Set in Damon Runyon's mythical New York City, this classic musical has been a favorite of audiences since it opened on Broadway in 1950. With an immortal score by Frank Loesser and Abe Burrows and Jo Swerling's fast-paced book, this romantic comedy is considered the perfect musical comedy by many. The legendary characters include: Sarah Brown, the uptight "mission doll", set out to reform Sky Masterson, the high-rolling gambler and Adelaide, the long suffering fiancé of Nathan Detroit and an ensemble of other engaging characters who inhabit this world from Times Square to the cafes of Havana to the sewers of New York.
