2.) You must provide a written summary about the concern. All concerns, notes, and resolutions will be maintained by the Director for the College of Applied Studies Advising for a period of three years.

3) Once received, the concern will be documented and addressed.

4) In some circumstances, it will be necessary to have all parties involved meet together to resolve the issue.

5) If the issue is still not resolved satisfactorily, the individual may request that the Director of the CAS Advising Center (CASA), arrange a meeting of all concerned with the Dean, Associate Dean or the Assistant Dean. The final authority in the Applied Studies programs is the Dean of the College.
