The tools and resources provided to the students will occur in a positive learning environment combining both theory and practice.

SASA Sponsors Trip to Dallas

Sport administration students have the opportunity to meet with employers from several elite Dallas-based sport organizations during a road trip April 11 and 12. The trip is being sponsored by the Sport Administration Student Association (SASA) in partnership with WSU's Office of Cooperative Education and Work-Based Learning.

While site hosts were still being secured as this newsletter was published, the NBA's Dallas Mavericks were confirmed as one of the hosts. After meeting with Mavs' personnel April 11, students will attend the team's game against the Memphis Grizzlies that night. The Baylor-Tom Landry Fitness Center and Cooper Institute are also on the trip itinerary. One or two other hosts will likely also be secured.

The cost of the trip is \$55 and interested students can sign up and pay cash in advance to the Co-op Office in Grace Wilkie Hall room 223. **The deadline for students to sign up is March 18.** In the event that more than the maximum number of students sign up, a faculty committee will select who gets to go based on major (priority to KSS students), GPA, classification (e.g., graduate, senior, junior) and extracurricular activities (e.g., SASA membership).

Each site visit is scheduled to include a meeting with that organization's internship coordinator regarding opportunities and requirements, a visit with one or more of that organization's current interns and a facility tour. The Mavericks are also planning to make select team vice presidents available for dialogue regarding career advancement in their specialty areas.

The Student Government Association and the College of Education have also made contributions to offset the costs involved in securing a bus and hotel rooms. In addition to the \$55, students taking the trip will be responsible for their food costs.

Career Fair Slated for March 31

A number of Wichita-area sport organizations seeking interns, seasonal employees and/or full-time employees will attend a career fair March 31 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Heskett Center. The event is being sponsored by the Sport Administration Student Association (SASA) in partnership with WSU's Office of Cooperative Education and Work-Based Learning.

All students are invited to attend at no charge. However, sport administration students are strongly encouraged to dress appropriately (i.e., business casual at minimum) and have their resumes/portfolios ready for review by potential employers.

Among those sport organizations that reserved career fair space early on were the Wichita Wranglers, the Wichita Thunder, the Wichita Aviators, the Maize Recreation Commission, Solo Management, and Genesis Health Clubs.
