

2009-10: A Year to Remember

This has been one of the busiest and most exciting years in the history of the sport management programs at WSU. As the academic year nears its conclusion, it seems appropriate to reflect on many of the key events that have made 2009-10 a memorable year.

July 15: The Commission on Sport Management Accreditation (COSMA) approves WSU's sport management programs as candidates for accreditation with their review scheduled for 2010-11.

Aug. 27: The Sport Management Student Association (SMSA) holds its annual bowling party with more than 50 students, faculty and staff enjoying pizza and bowling at Northrock Lanes.

Sept. 18: SMSA holds a tailgate cookout prior to a WSU volleyball match. Athletic department staff members join the group for the pregame meal.

Oct. 16: SMSA co-sponsors the Shock Cancer Walk at Charles Koch Arena. The event generated more than \$8,000 in proceeds going to the American Cancer Society.

Nov. 12: Sport Management Recognition Night features a number of awards going to individuals with exceptional achievements/contributions to the department. Dr. Steve Dittmore of the University of Arkansas is the keynote speaker.

December: Dr. Mark Vermillion secures his fifth publication of the year in a peer -reviewed research journal. The publications in which his work was featured include *The Journal of Sport Administration and Supervision* and the *International Journal of Sport Management*.

Dec. 11: SMSA holds its end-of-thesemester social at Louie's.

Jan. 6: The Sport Management Alumni Association (SMAA) awards four \$500 fellowships to deserving students.

Jan. 19: The spring semester begins with Mike Ross joining the sport management faculty.

Feb. 1: The Sport Management Advisory Council, a group comprised of students, alumni, and practitioners, holds its annual meeting, reviewing the programs' effectiveness and making recommendations regarding future directions.

March 6: Department administrative manager Mary Myers receives the Honor Award in recognition of her service to the Sport and Recreation Law Association.

March 12: SMSA sponsors a trip to Oklahoma City to meet with staff members from the NBA Thunder franchise and see that night's Thunder victory over New Jersey.

April 6: The annual Sport Management Career Fair, co-sponsored by SMSA and the Office of Cooperative Education, draws more than 12 exhibitors and nearly 75 guests.

April 12: Dr. Jeff Noble is named as the recipient of the 2010 College of Education Teaching Award.

April 20: The annual SMSA -SMAA baseball cookout is held prior to that night's Shocker game against

The 2010 recipient of the WSU College of Education Teaching Award is Dr. Jeff Noble, instructor in sport management. Dr. Noble was elected as the award winner by the college's Faculty Personnel Committee and will be recognized for his accomplishment in a number of ways over the next year.

"This is an important honor, and Dr. Noble is a worthy recipient," said Dr. Clay Stoldt, department chair. "He is a dedicated and talented teacher, and I know the selection committee was particularly impressed by his commitment to continual improvement in his teaching methods."



Dr. Noble joined the WSU faculty in 2004, and he teaches

courses ranging from the Introduction to Sport Management class required of all undergraduate majors to the Management in Sport course required within the master's program. He consistently receives high teaching and advising ratings and has been nominated for WSU's prestigious Academy for Effective Teaching Award.
