Among our assessment activities and preparations were:

- We used the MCLL rubrics for evaluating writing samples for each major taking the capstone course, Spanish/French 526. Maria Akrabova, Rose Estill, Melissa Goldstein, Mike McGlynn, Mireya Serna, and Kerry Wilks rated forty-one samples of MCLL majors with a specialization in Spanish, and Marat Sanatullov and Wilson Baldridge rated eight samples in the French specialization.
- Alejandra Bonifacino (Spanish) and Dr. Brigitte Roussel (French) gave OPIs to thirty students in Spanish/French 525, a capstone course, including 22 majors.
- Rose Estill, Marat Sanatullov, and Yumi Foster served on the PreK-12 Foreign Language Program Committee, which is chaired by Dr. Sanatullov, and includes two professors from the College of Education.
- The MCLL Assessment and Curriculum Committee met on 21 August 2009 to discuss various topics, including the upcoming Board of Regents Review.
- Assessment Committee Chair Mike McGlynn has begun developing a new student evaluation form designed with the specific needs of language teaching in mind. This on-going project will be addressed in 2010 and 2011.
