To pursue the minor in University Honors, a student must be admitted to the Dorothy and Bill Cohen Honors College. There are **no minimum ACT/SAT or GPA requirements** for admission to the Cohen Honors College. Interested students submit an online application through the link on the college website.

Requirements

To receive a diploma distinction of *minor in university honors*, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.250 and complete 18 honors credit hours comprising:

HNRS 102 Honors Colloquium (0 credit)

HNRS 103 Honors Colloquium Portfolio (0 credit)

One honors general education seminar (HNRS-prefix course) or WSUN honors first-year seminar O(3 credits)

Research or Design-Thinking Experience (3 credits)

Options include:

HNRS 310X (2) and HNRS 410 (1) FYRE First-Year Research Experience seminar and independent study

HNRS 306J Lead for Tomorrow: Problems (3) and HNRS 398N Lead for Tomorrow: Solutions (1)

HNRS 406C Making Social Impact (3)

HNRS 485 Honors Independent Research or Creative Activity (3)

HNRS 486 Honors Collaborative Research (3)

HNRS 491 Honors Thesis (3)

ID 300H Design-Thinking Honors (3)

Students have the option of completing an area-of-emphasis within their University Honors Minor by selecting an Emory Lindquist Honors Scholar, Honors Leadership, Honors Law & Public Policy, or Departmental Honors track. Track requirements are listed separately in the catalog.

Students are <u>not required</u> to complete an area-of-emphasis track, but students who do will receive a transcript notation listing the area of emphasis.

A student must complete 3 unduplicated credit hours (credit hours not used toward general education or toward the student's major requirements) in a minor program of study.

Justification

Describe and justify the change and its place in the department's and/or college's overall curriculum plan.

This curriculum change proposal simplifies the University Honors minor while retaining the original concept and most of the original elements of the minor curriculum. The National Collegiate Honors Council defines honors education as in-class and out-of-class experiences that are broader, deeper, or more complex. These new requirements for University Honors still meet that definition but allow students more flexibility:

- Students may choose to but aren't required to complete one of the existing honors tracks (called "area-of-emphasis tracks" in this proposal) as part of their minor.
- The expanded list of courses to meet the research requirement reflects student petitions for exceptions over the past 8 years and developments in areas such as innovation and design.
- An 18-credit minor aligns better with credit hour requirements for other minors across campus.
- These requirements also align better with other honors program/college curricula, particularly Purdue University and James Madison University (See https://honors.purdue.edu/ and https://www.jmu.edu/honors/curriculum.shtml).
