NOTES:

All fees are based on a 5 month period for a fall or spring semester.

- Figures are estimates given by Host University. Figures were given in host currency and converted to United States Dollars using a floating exchange rate.
As of 07/19/22, 1 Japanese Yen (JPY) = 0.0072 USD
- Accommodations are given at 62,300 yen per month in their recommended dormitory, Dormy Soshigaya-Okura. Additional fees are added in the estimate to cover cleaning, building maintenance, utilities, and internet.
- The dorm meal plan is 17,400 yen a month, which is estimated to cover 60% of meals. At the same price rate, 100% of meals should cost 29,000 yen a month.
- Books/study materials are budgeted for 30,000 yen per semester.
- There is local transportation within Tokyo to and from the university. The commuting pass is accounted for 17,500 yen per semester.
- The LewerMark Student Insurance Plan is required for international travel. The total cost is based on the total number of days the student is abroad. As of July 2022, it cost \$1.16 per day for a maximum \$100,000 coverage and \$100 deductible. 152 days (5 months) will be approximately \$180. There are different coverage plans available at different prices.
- For Aoyama Gakuin University, international students are required to participate in the National Health Insurance (NHI) Program. The monthly premium is approximately 2,000 yen.
- US citizens are exempt from visa fees.
- Airfare cost was provided according to Orbitz as of July 2022 with travel dates of January 12, 2023 – June 8, 2023. This should provide a good estimate to cover the airfare expense.
- Personal expense estimates are provided by Financial Aid for students living on the WSU campus, which will be similar during a study abroad program.

*** Tuition and Fees are based on the Resident rate for 12 undergraduate credit hours at Wichita State University. Students will pay their current tuition rate during the study abroad program based on their residency and any specific college/department requirements.**

Disclaimer: All costs are estimates and subject to change. Some universities will require payment for accommodations in advance as well as other fees. In order to apply for visas, students may be required to show proof of funds, such as bank statements, to live in a host country. Please note extra travel expenses are not included. Budget accordingly.
