


The District 1 – CBA Process


- CBA Focus Group Participant Recruitment & Registration

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






















Question 1 - What do $\underline{\textbf{YOU}}$ feel are the greatest needs in the community?

(175 Comments)

- The dynamic between campus and the neighborhoods; there is a lot of potential; that is something that I think a lot can be done; it can benefit students; even Fairmont Coffee shop is far for some student; create a synergy affect
- In the heart of the CBA Boundaries seeing more ownership and less absentee landlords; more ownership for those living and working in this area
- Education in the community; even with food and understanding healthy foods; around finance and economics – how to budget; figure out how to put resources in place so that no matter what happens around the globe we are still able to survive; need for basic information

- $\circ~$ Need for mentorship








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


Question 2 - What do <u>YOU</u> feel is keeping the community from meeting these needs?

- Lack of practicing cooperative economics (if we would just cooperate, we could have these things to alleviate some of our stress)




- Lack of business people who are willing to invest in all of these needs in District 1. Seems like most successful collaborations happen between community members, businesses, and the city – Much investment is extended to WSU. Feels like the community members support educational opportunities at WSU, but not benefiting; There need to be more collaboration; i.e. VISTA programs – can do more community focused projects. "They can invest in the community the way that they invest in the community." Lobbied hard to get Whole Foods to build on campus (ended up on 13th/Webb)
- Organizations that are "coasting"; not actually working to address community needs
- $\circ\,$ Lack of trust and lack of follow through with those who have come to help
- There are groups/organizations that are trying to address needs; working in silos; not working with each other; often working against each other for grants/resources

SUMMARY OF FOCUS GROUP FINDINGS

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The District 1 – CBA Process Focus Group Responses Question 2 - What do YOU feel is keeping the community from meeting these needs? (Comments 111) Issues of communication and marketing to get their message/services out and known to the public; an issue of people simply not knowing about what is happening; time/money to get voices heard There seems to be a lack of resources for mobilizing enthusiasm around these type of issues. (in other communities, even as newcomer this person was able to act informed end emphilize accound logitations.)

- these type of issues. (in other communities, even as newcomer this person was able to get informed and mobilize around key issues in that community.); similar networks haven't been found on how to get plugged in here in Wichita. You have to piece it together for yourself. Much more extensive networks for organizational supports for those who have a shared interest in addressing some of these concerns
- Overpolicing; instead of investing into policing neighborhoods, those monies can go into investing into community centers and our youth
- Lack of not understanding how small businesses are run and created


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Question 2 - What do <u>YOU</u> feel is keeping the community from meeting these needs?

(Comments 111)

- Loss of Dillons/Walmart; they can find money to put dollar stores in our area; but when you want produce and healthy groceries, Save a Lot has them but not a full array
- $^\circ\,$ Lack of intentional investment by the City; investing those dollars back into the heart District 1
- Looking to the west of WSU and WSU; multimillion dollar corporate innovation campus; neighbors to the west are languishing; missing partnership with the WSU. WSU is in an Opportunity Zone; What is their responsibility to the community? Thought that if they had their way there would be no residential but an expansion of industrial.
- Capital and lack of information; most people don't really know how to articulate what they need collectively; don't know how to connect or organize within the district; information is a critical piece; there are ways to get what you need; have to be able to find the middle ground

- Ranges from political figures (local, state, and federal), organizational heads, nonprofit organizations, faith-based institutions and leaders, WSU, Some duplication, neighborhood associations and neighborhood association leadership, business owners, developers, local media providers, housing organizations and their leadership, local cultural institutions and their leadership, USD 259, youth, medical providers, grassroot leaders (non-affiliated), etc...
- Some are currently involved in the CBA process; Some are not... YET.

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



Question 4 - What and where are potential projects (actual buildings, streets, intersections etc...) that YOU would like to see redeveloped / developed in this community?

- Fairmount neighborhood








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STANDARDS FOR OUR COMMUNITY!

4. Employment / Jobs / Training


I AFFIRM my support for a community where no matter our age or background, we have the opportunity to be both gainfully employed and personally empowered to financially support ourselves and our loved ones.
