**2+2 Articulation Agreement
Between
Wichita State University (WSU) and Butler Community College**

The purpose of this 2+2 agreement is to provide Butler Community College students the opportunity to transfer coursework from Butler Community College to Wichita State University (WSU) in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree with a major in social work.

This agreement is for Butler Community College students who have:

- Earned an Associates of Arts (A.A.) or Associates of Science (A.S.) degree
- Achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Applied for admission to WSU

Butler Community College students meeting the above requirements will:

- Be guaranteed admission to WSU with completion of application requirements and receipt of transcripts
- Enter with junior status toward a baccalaureate degree
- Be guaranteed to transfer all credits (100 level and higher) up to but not exceeding 64 credits from Butler Community College with an earned grade of a C or better



For graduation from WSU with a Social Work degree, students will need to fulfill transfer coursework from Butler Community College along with all WSU general education requirements, degree requirements, and must meet all requirements for graduation as outlined by WSU.
