

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
 BETWEEN
 WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY AND NEOSHO COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
 May 28, 2015
 Revised February 17, 2017

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to provide learning opportunities through a transfer agreement in regards to the Neosho County Community College (Neosho) Associate in Criminal Justice degree for those students pursuing a Bachelors of Science in Criminal Justice degree from the Fairmount College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at Wichita State University. This transfer agreement will follow the guidelines in the WSU Undergraduate Catalog for all transfer students.

Students should refer to transfer sheets for the required courses at each institution. Transfer students must complete at least 60 hours of four-year college work and 45 hours of upper-division work in order to qualify for graduation from Wichita State University.

The following criminal justice courses must be completed by a Neosho student transferring into WSU with the earned Associate in Criminal Justice degree. This depicts criminal justice curriculum only.

- **Core Criminal Justice Courses to be completed at WSU 15 credit hours to include:**
 CJ391 Corrections (WSU)
 CJ392 Law Enforcement (WSU)
 CJ394 Courts and judicial systems (WSU)
 CJ407 Introduction to research (WSU)
 CJ598 Contemporary issues in criminal justice (WSU)
- **Correlate Core Course Requirements (6 Credit Hours) to Include:**
 Ethnic Studies 360 Dealing w/ diversity
 English 210 Composition: Business, professional, and technical writing (unless Crim126 “Interview and Report Writing” is taken at Neosho)



Summary:

- 18 Hours of Criminal Justice courses taken at Neosho
- 21 credit hours of criminal justice courses taken at WSU
 - 15 core credit hours
 - Minimum of 6 elective CJ elective credit hours WSU
 - Total Criminal Justice Credit Hours 39
 - May take up to 11 additional elective hours in CJ at WSU not to exceed 50 CJ credit hours
- 6 credit hours of correlate core courses taken at WSU (unless Crim126 “Interview and Report Writing” is taken at Neosho”)
- Students must also satisfy the Fairmount College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (including the foreign language requirement) and the university’s requirements for the Bachelor of Science Degree.




