The American Collegiate Rowing Association was founded in the spring of 2008 through the hard work of club rowing coaches. The organization held its first national championship that May in Oklahoma City, OK with 43 programs and 687 athletes in attendance. Four years later, the championship included 51 programs and 1283 athletes. Membership to the ACRA is open to all club programs and those varsity programs prohibited from entering either the NCAA or IRA championships.
