
WHAT CAN VUB DO FOR VETERANS?

Veterans Upward Bound was established by the Department of Education as a part of the Trio program to help veterans achieve their educational goals in 1972. This program is 100% free to eligible veterans and can help veterans who struggle with motivation, knowledge of the application process. We have programs to build skills in math and language arts to help veterans pass entrance exams. Other services we offer are mentoring, career counseling, tutoring, resume building, forms assistance, practice exams, even Rosetta Stone for learning a new language.
