

What is an **ACTIVE THREAT?**

An Active Threat is a person(s) who is causing or threatening to cause dead and/or serious bodily injury. This isn't exclusive to somebody with a firearm. This could be accomplished with a knife, or a bat, or with personal body weapons. It is for this reason that we refer to such a person(s) as an Active Threat.

An event is unpredictable and evolves quickly. Knowing what to do can save lives.

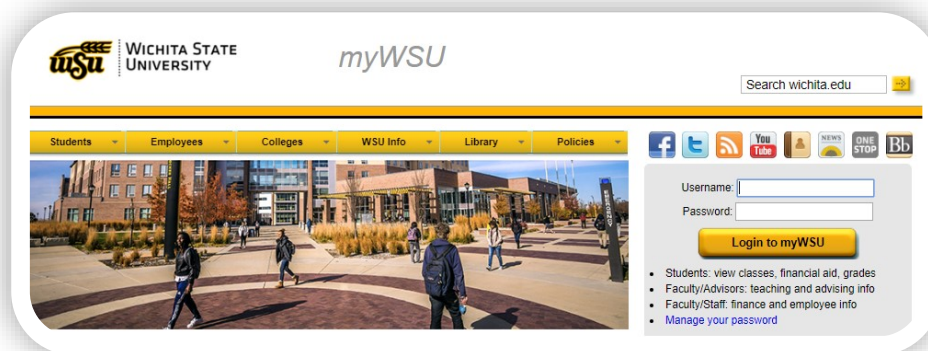

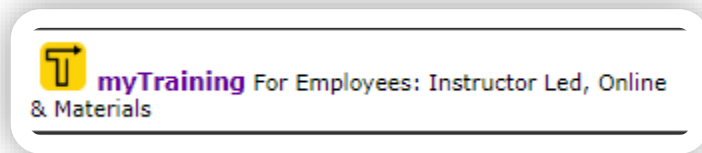
1. Login to **myWSU**

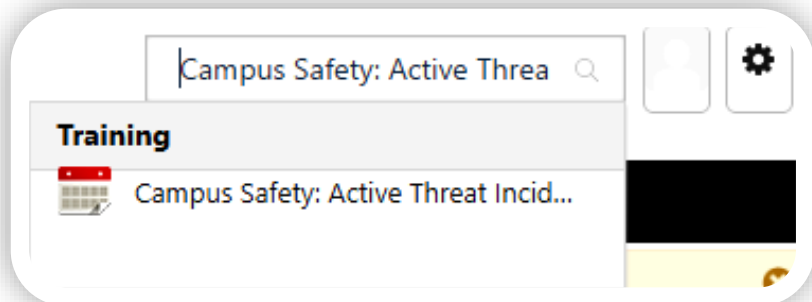
2. Select **myTraining**
