- WSU is on track to becoming a Hispanic Serving institution by 2030


Goal 1: Accessible and Affordable Education

- Increase enrollment
 - WSU enrollment of 17,000 by 2025
 - WSU Tech to 6500 by 2025
 - WSU Fall 2022 = 16,921
- Increase need-based aid
