#### Presence and interaction

- Presence means being there and being seen too
- Student-student, studentprofessor, student-content interaction
- All kinds of interaction are important
- Don't assume students "know" when you worked



## Responsiveness is key



- Communicate expected response times
- Stick to them
- Email, posting, grading
- It's less important to be fast and more important to be predicatble


#### Let the computer do what it's good at



- Let the computer do what it is good at, not what it's bad at!
  - Objective test grading = yes!
  - Tool use just because of tool availability = no!
- Use your time to do what you are good at
  - Reading and responding to reflective/subjective work = yes!
  - Printing assignments to handscore and re-scan = no!

#### Practical advice

- Announcements are important.
  Use them, and feel free to schedule them in advance
- Re-using content is fine, but make sure to go in and "edit" things like discussion prompts to change their dates
- Use the "rubrics" tool for grading but also include grading comments and in-line marks
