

- Exert more effort in class
- Important to evaluate satisfaction data about curricula/co-curricula at the program, college, and university level

□ For improvement purposes

- Make curricula/co-curricula more effective
- Responsive to student needs



  - Indirect measures





Received advising pre-enrollment (UG Q12)




Figure 2: Competence in Skills (Undergraduate Exit Survey Q21 to Q27)






### Exit Survey: Career related

Figure 3: Relationship of Degree Program to Job and Career


Percent responding degree program is directly related to current job (UG Q37; GR Q65):


Satisfaction with library hours (UG Q53)

# **Common Uses of Exit Survey Data**

- > Adjust class scheduling to (qs. 5-7):
  - Meet students availability
  - Provide a variety of courses for a specific major
- Modify program to make more relevant
  - Assess student perception on usefulness of degree in career (q. 37)
- Assess high impact practices (e.g., COOP, practica experiences) and improvement in learning (qs. 21-35)
- Adjust advising based on feedback (qs. 12-20)
