 - ❑ Required via Application for Degree Card (AFD)
 - ❑ 2000-2002 testing
 - ❑ 2003 live as paper-based survey
 - ❑ Use in program assessment
 - ❑ Limitations.

- Tied to the AFD system online– other banner schools

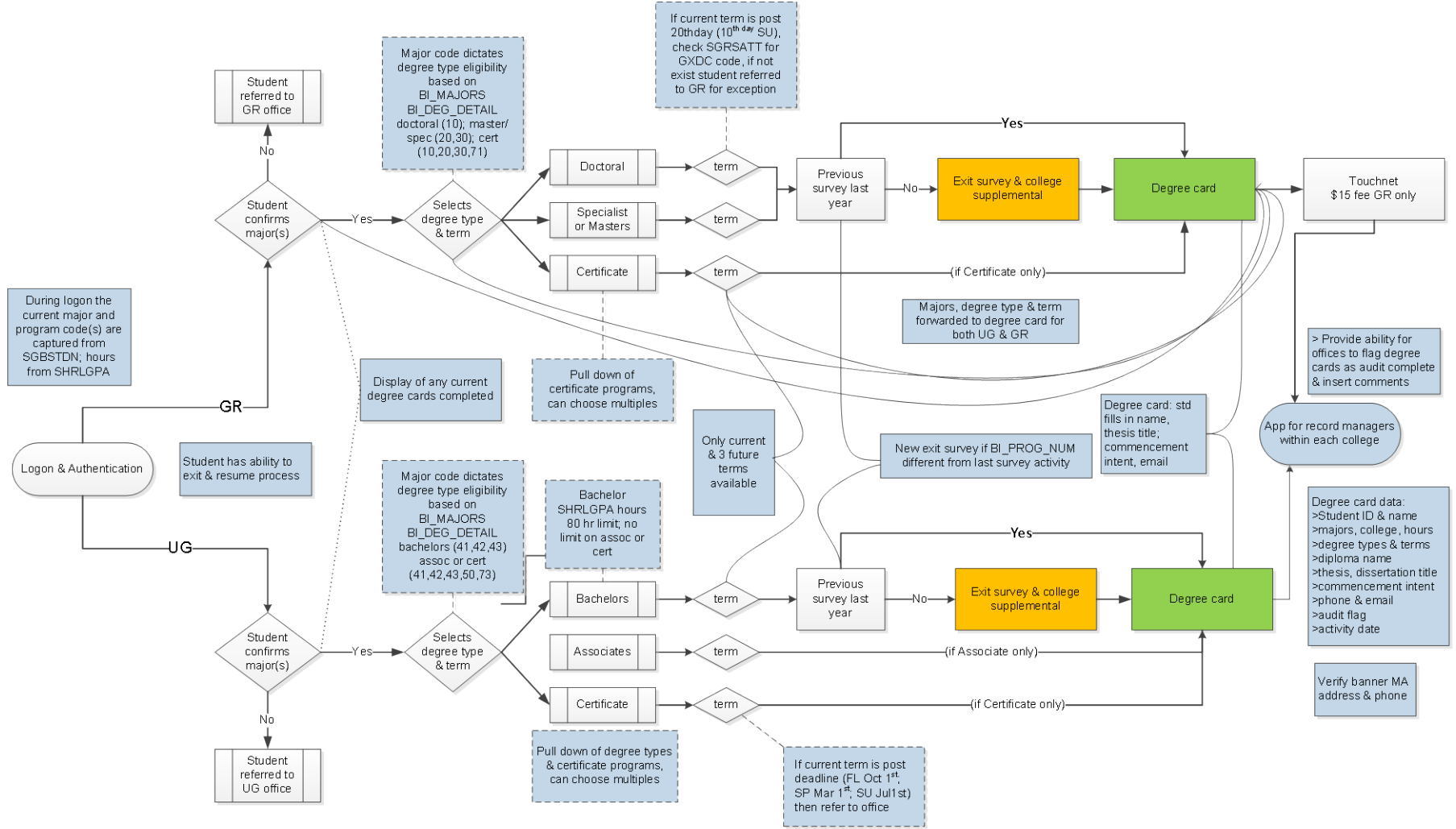

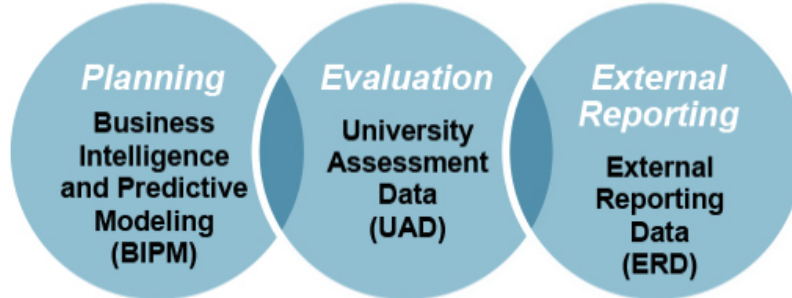

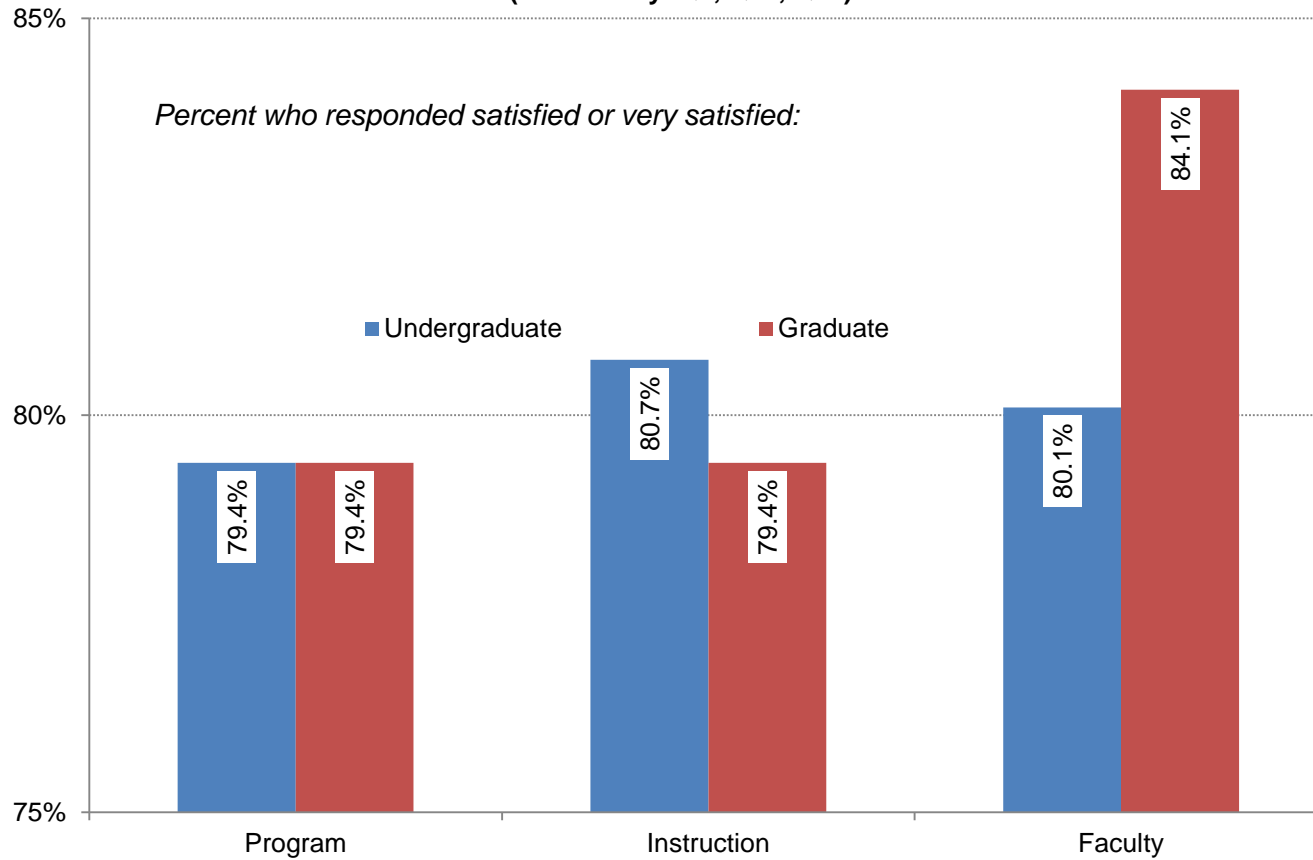
- Data from exit surveys has been well researched

 - Exert more effort in class
- Important to evaluate satisfaction data about curricula/co-curricula at the program, college, and university level
 - ❑ For improvement purposes
 - Make curricula/co-curricula more effective
 - Responsive to student needs

 - Indirect measures

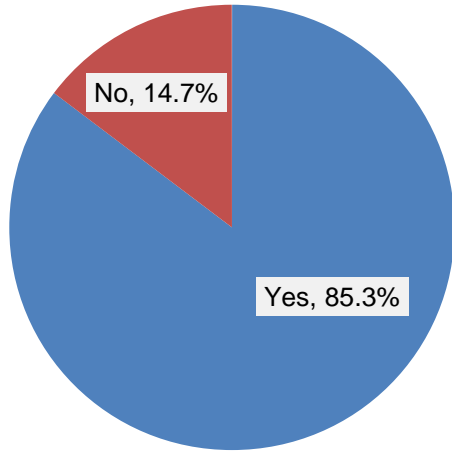

(Exit Survey Q4, Q11, Q10)

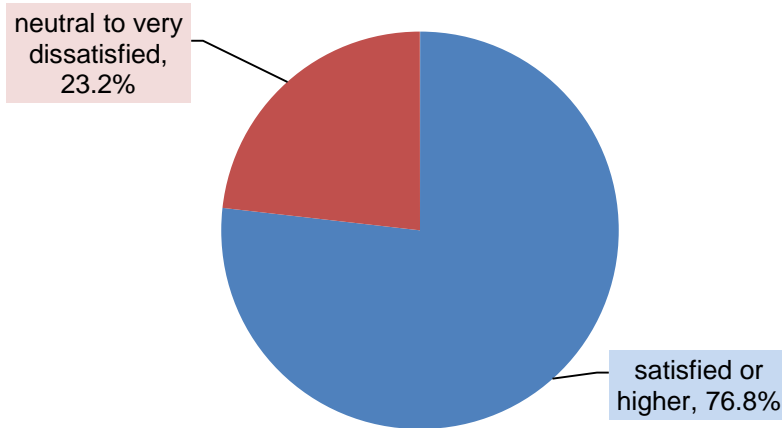


Exit Survey: Advising

Received advising pre-enrollment (UG Q12)



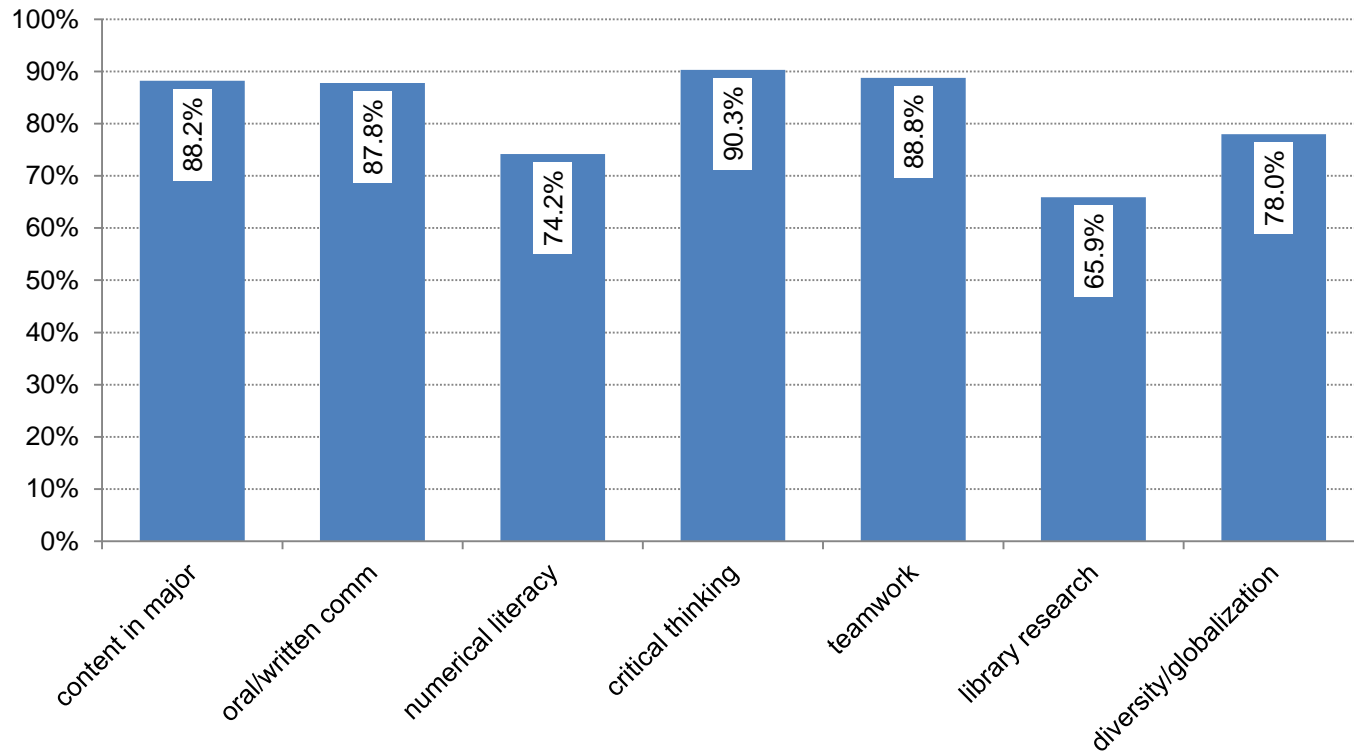
Satisfaction with advising (UG Q20)

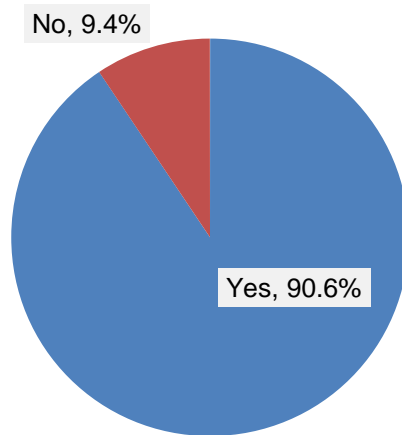
**Figure 2: Competence in Skills

Percent responding 4 or higher (scale 1 – 5) on perception of competency:

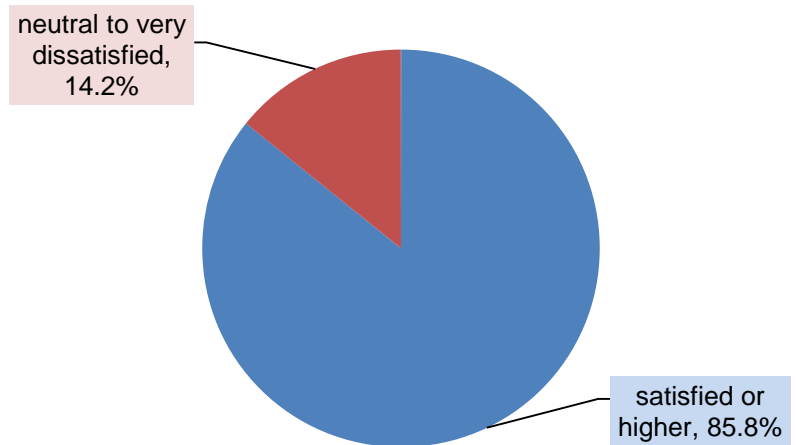

Need access to WSU technology (UG Q36)

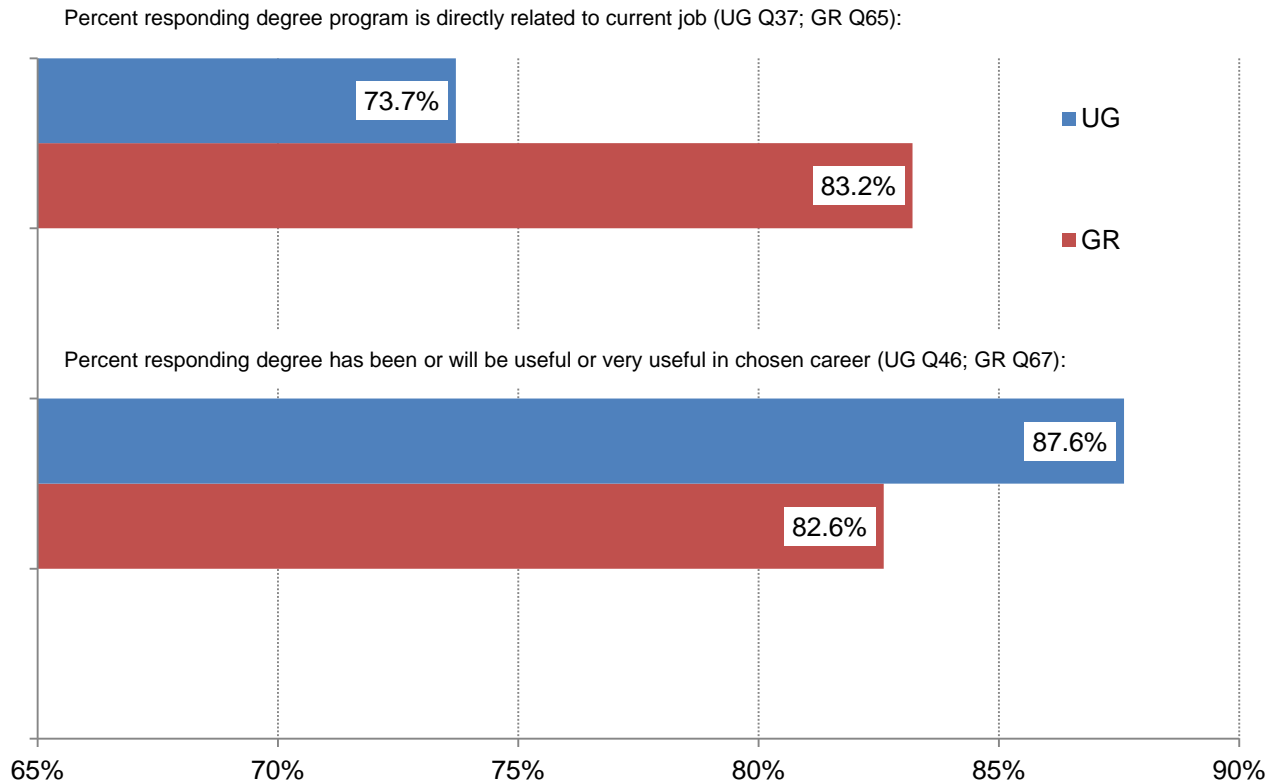


Satisfaction with WSU technology (UG Q36)



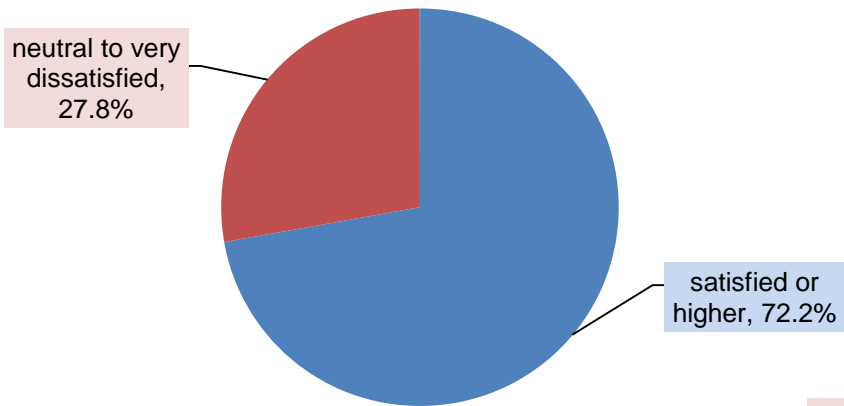
Exit Survey: Career related

Figure 3: Relationship of Degree Program to Job and Career

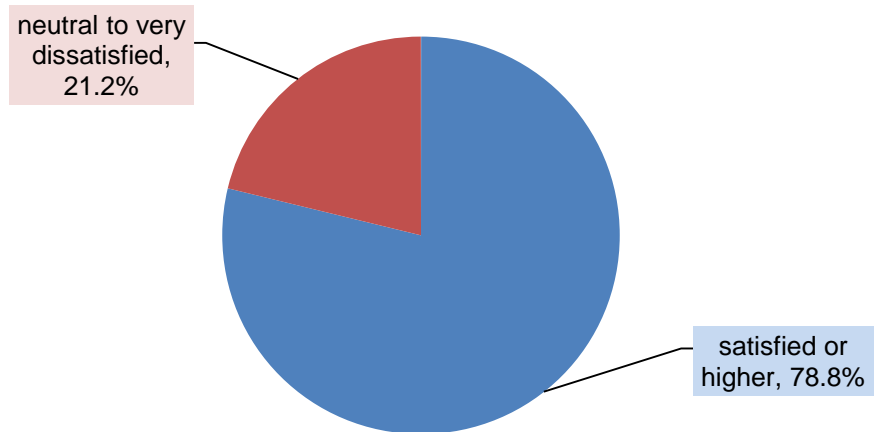


Exit Survey: Library

Satisfaction with library hours (UG Q53)

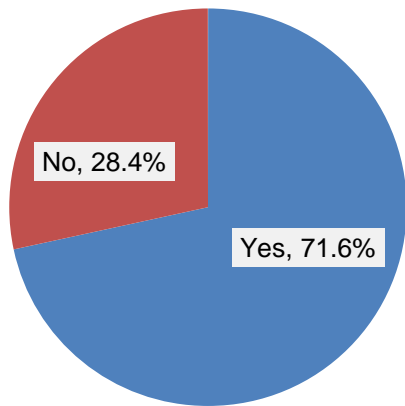


Satisfaction with library (overall) (UG Q57)

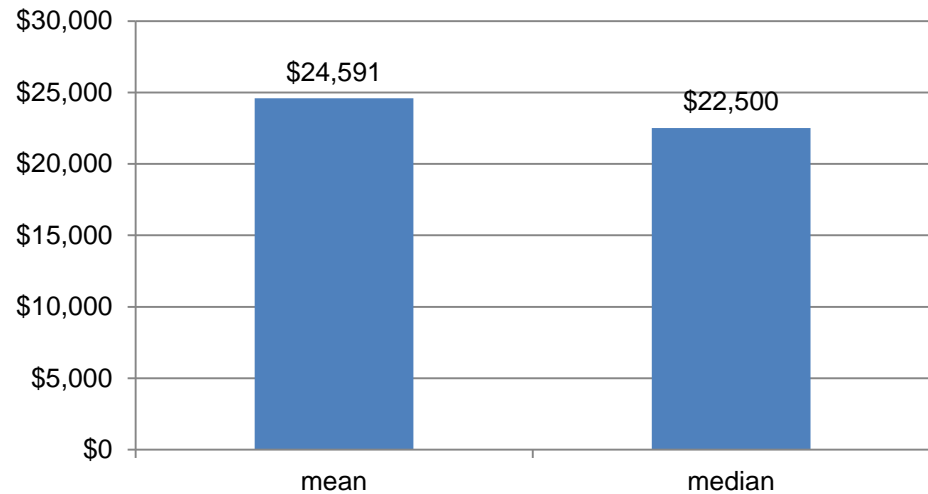

 - Provide a variety of courses for a specific major
- Modify program to make more relevant
 - Assess student perception on usefulness of degree in career (q. 37)
- Assess high impact practices (e.g., COOP, practica experiences) and improvement in learning (qs. 21-35)
- Adjust advising based on feedback (qs. 12-20)
